

ScreenNJ Partner Information Sheet Inflatable Colon & Outreach Event Support

ScreenNJ is a statewide initiative to improve health outcomes and reduce health disparities in New Jersey in the focus areas of lung and colorectal cancer screening and prevention, and we are looking to connect and support provider agencies throughout the state that refer patients to or directly provide screening services for lung and/or colorectal cancer, as well as to help providers initiate or expand these type of screening and outreach services.

Small Giant Colon (4 ft tall x 6 ft wide)



Large Giant Colon (12 ft tall x 12 ft wide x 10 ft long)



- Easy Set-Up -- the small one takes about 3 minutes to fully inflate; the arch takes about 8-10 minutes.
- Can be used inside and outside -- need to be tethered / tied down if outside; can't be used outdoors in high winds.
- Run on electric motors / fans, so can be used inside without needing special ventilation -- need normal electric power with a 3-pronged outlet within 50 feet of the area you want them to be -- we provide the extension cords, but you provide the power. They can also run on generator power (but you'd have to provide that yourself).
- Bi-lingual English / Spanish signs describing different conditions (healthy colon, pre-cancerous polyps, colon cancer, etc.)
- Attract people to your educational content; engage community members to educate them on colorectal cancer prevention, screening, symptoms, and services.
