

LUNG CANCER SCREENING EDUCATION OPPORTUNITY

Lung cancer is the leading cause of cancer death in both men and women, often because it is detected too late. Early detection of lung cancer through low-dose CT scans has proven to be an effective way to reduce mortality and improve outcomes. Unfortunately, rates of lung cancer screening are very low among those eligible for this life-saving procedure. Low screening rates are due, in part, to lack knowledge about this important screening among both providers and the general public.

ScreenNJ is offering a learning opportunity for healthcare providers and other staff members that interact with patients to increase knowledge of lung cancer screening with a goal of increasing referrals for lung cancer screening. Trained educators deliver a 30-45 minute presentation that will cover the following:
