

Could your patient benefit from genetic counseling?

Consider referring them to genetic counseling if they have.



- Diagnosis of breast, colon, or uterine cancer before age 50
- 3 or more relatives with the same type of cancer on the same side of the family
- A known ancestry that is associated with a higher risk for certain cancers. *(Ex: Ashkenazi Jewish, South African, etc.)*
- Multiple types of cancer in a single person
- Multiple colon polyps
- Co-occurring or metachronous bilateral cancers (Ex: breast, lung, ovary, etc.)
- Ovarian, Fallopian tube or Primary Peritoneal Cancer
- Metastatic prostate cancer
- Pancreatic cancer
- Male breast cancer
- Triple negative breast cancer
